Garbage & Recycling

Earlier this year, GFL acquired LRS, the company that previously held our garbage and recycling contract. GFL agreed to honor the Town's contract through the end of 2026 with no changes to service, routes or pickup days, or bulk pickup procedures. They retained the same customer service phone number: 608-580-0580. For bulk pickup scheduling or service issues, please continue to contact that number.

As our contract nears its end in late 2026, the Town Board will begin reviewing options for waste collection services in spring 2026. Residents are encouraged to watch agendas and attend meetings if they wish to provide public comment.

- December 31: 8am – 12pm
- January 12: 2pm - 4pm
- January 17: 8am - 10am
- January 19: 9am - 11am
- January 31: 8am - 11am

Payments can be made by cash or check in person, mailed, or left in the secure drop box outside Town Hall.

- First installment due Jan 31, 2026
